SALISBURY CYCLING THE GOOD NEWS ...

In Laverstock, where Wiltshire Council have put in an experimental cycling scheme to send the message that cyclists have priority on this important link for school and commuter journeys. The middle white line on Laverstock Road has been removed and advisory cycle lanes, each 5ft wide, have been put down both sides of the road.

Motorists may find this perplexing at first, but the idea is that the cycleways serve as a continual reminder that the possibility of meeting cyclists is high. The visual narrowing of the carriageway is intended to act as a traffic calming measure to slow vehicles down while encouraging more people to cycle.

This new route has been developed by Wiltshire Council in partnership with Sustrans and is part funded by Cycling England through the links to schools programme. This route sends an important message to motorists that they need to take account of cyclists and change their driving style accordingly. It is on trial for a year initially and COGS very much hope it will prove to be a success.


8 ...AND THE BAD NEWS

The **junction of Estcourt Road and Churchill Way** continues to give problems. Cyclists are consistently being involved in accidents or near-misses at this junction as motorists leave Churchill way to travel along Estcourt road – often taking a short cut to get to St Paul's roundabout.

Since April 2008, four cyclists have been involved in accidents that have been reported to the police and we have reports of others where the police have not been called. On the 26th June a young mum was knocked off her bike and unfortunately broke her wrist and collar bone and on the 7th July another lady was run into but fortunately did not require hospital treatment. The latest incident occurred on the 17th August when a vehicle pulled out in front of yet another cyclist, who narrowly avoided hitting the vehicle concerned.

The response by Wiltshire Council so far has been to cut the vegetation back and realign the road markings. Neither of these steps appears to have solved the problem at this particular "Collision Cluster" site. COGS have been told that Wiltshire County Highways Dept will be investigating further in late August early September – as we go to press there has been no further feedback.

Salisbury police have received complaints from members of the public about cyclists riding on pavements and disobeying the Highway Code in other ways such as jumping red lights. FUNDRAISING FOR QUAKER MEETING HOUSE


